WELCOME

The English Montessori School, Madrid, with over 750 students 2–18 years old, is recognised as one of the top 20 schools in Spain through the prestigious El Mundo ranking. We celebrated our 50th Anniversary last year, and are moving to a brand new state-of-the -art building for Primary and Secondary in September 2025.

At the English Montessori School, we blend British Education with Montessori values for a holistic approach to nurture each child's growth. Starting from Early Years, students start with the enriching Montessori environment, fostering independence and curiosity. As they transition into the British Curriculum taught by native teachers, alongside a strong Spanish Curriculum, we ensure rigour in their academic journey. They maintain Montessori principles throughout their school time in the Explore lessons. With emotional education, multilingual proficiency, and environmental stewardship, we empower our students to be successful at school, university and the world of work. 


HOW TO APPLY
