
















YEAR 2 – NUMERACY RUTH & ROSIE

Tener el honor de felicitar a nuestros alumnos por un reconocimiento internacional de las pruebas de Español de la Universidad de Cambridge, ya se va convirtiendo en un hábito del Departamento todos los años. Sin lugar a dudas, como ya señalaba Aristóteles: "Somos lo que hacemos repetidamente. La excelencia, por tanto no es un acto, sino un hábito". Y nuestros alumnos han aplicado esta máxima y queremos felicitarles por sus premios: en primer lugar, enhorabuena a Cristina Calvo, Premio a la mejor alumna del mundo en A Level. Y por otro lado, nuestra felicitación a Gonzalo López por su premio al mejor alumno de España en AS Level de Español de la Universidad de Cambridge. Y seguimos trabajando en el desarrollo de competencias comunicativas que diferencien a nuestros alumnos y que hagan que brillen en dichos exámenes (aplicamos técnicas de expresión que demuestren el dominio de la comunicación oral y escrita en español como: los títulos con valor connotativo y estético, refranero castellano, elementos de intertextualidad de la literatura española, tecnicismos lingüísticos... En este cuaderno, el alumno y su familia pueden tener un recuerdo de sus primeros escritos en castellano desde que comenzaba la asignatura de Lengua en el colegio.



I+D+I EN LA MEJORA DEL TALLER LITERARIO: ENCUESTA A LOS ALUMNOS

Para seguir mejorando en el taller literario, se han escuchado las motivaciones e interés por el mismo, por parte de los alumnos de Y7, Y8 y Y9. Hemos querido también conocer si esta herramienta, la escritura, constituye un apoyo como herramienta de gestión de las emociones (y apoya el desarrollo de la inteligencia emocional).

La profesora Chus López, ha desarrollado una encuesta que se ha aplicado a los cursos: Y7, Y8 y Y9. De esta encuesta, se ha identificado que a algunos niños no les gusta que se lean en alto sus relatos (se hacía para poder ser puntuados también por sus compañeros). El próximo curso, solo participarán en el premio del alumnado los alumnos que lo deseen (participarán los demás estudiantes en el resto de premios).

Y queremos destacar literalmente, los comentarios de una encuesta que explica perfectamente la relación entre inteligencia emocional y la herramienta del taller literario. La pregunta de la encuesta era: justifica las razones por las que te gusta escribir o por las que no te gusta: "hay veces que cuando escribo, me sumerjo en el mundo que he creado. Me gusta tener el poder de manipular a los personajes, formar sus vidas, dibujarlos en mi cabeza, ponerles faltas y perfecciones...Me gusta poder ponerles nombres y personalidades. Pero lo que más me gusta es planear sus vidas. Lo que les pasa, si se mueren, si se enamoran, etc...Para mí, lo más difícil es pensar en un título".



Music in the Senior Department

Music is about experiencing and experimenting with sounds. Apart from singing, students in the Senior Department get regular opportunities to perform on instruments. This year, for example, we have done the following:

- Blues: following the 12-bar blues pattern, students accompanied a classic blues piece using the chord function on an electronic keyboard
- Fugue: students performed a four-part fugue using percussion instruments
- Film music: in groups, students created their own music to accompany a film clip, using a wide range of instruments

Here are some of the aspects of music we studied this year:

Medieval Music

Students sang and danced to some of the oldest recorded popular medieval pieces, and learned about some medieval instruments such as the 'hurdy gurdy'. (Did you know that 'hurdy gurdy' means 'shake your bottom'? - Dt was a dance instrument.)

Film Music

- . To promote positive healthy mindsets.




Every student finds something that they really enjoy.




"You need to stop playing with these violent cowboy toys," the mother said. She looked at the name on the figurine's soles. "This one's Evil McKill!"




